## PMTA Website and Member Directory:

Work is progressing on the NEW PMTA website, which will be friendlier to smartphone and i-Pad users. Jackie Herbein (PMTA Treasurer and former President) and our new web administrator, Millie Eben (former PMTA President) have been spending a great deal of time in the development of the new site.

As noted in a recent e-blast, we are offering membership the option of:

- **1. Listing all information**, including e-mail, street address, and telephone, as imported from the MTNA Membership list of dues-paid members, into the new Member Directory; or
  - 2. Listing name and instrument or voice only.

Keeping this member database up to date is a monumental task; I tried my hand at it and spent several hours just reviewing A and B in the old directory. Many ex-members had been retained for years in the directory without paying dues. We have carefully considered the question of allowing members to choose a smorgasbord of options or specific deletions, and decided that this would not be affordable (since we pay for this service, on a per-service basis) especially since it would have to be done each year in the same way. Research showed that it was **common in most states to list full information**. A few members, fewer than twenty, voiced some objection and/or asked for deletions. While accommodating those, we hope that most of you will be satisfied with the new <u>directory</u> and find it helpful as well as no threat to your security.

At any rate, we hope to have the new site up and running by early September. Best wishes, Jackie and Millie!
